





Did You Know?

On July 2nd, 1776, the Continental Congress voted in favor of independence, and two days later (July 4th) delegates from the 13 colonies adopted the Declaration of Independence, a



historic document drafted by Thomas Jefferson. John Adams believed that July 2nd was the correct UNITED STATES OF AMERICA: date on which to celebrate the birth of American independence, and would reportedly turn down

invitations to appear at July 4th events in protest.

Adams and Thomas Jefferson both died within hours of each other, on July 4, 1826—the 50th anniversary of the adoption of the Declaration of Independence.
